What is a design patent examiner?

A design patent examiner is a federal employee who examines applications to determine whether or not a design patent can be granted. Design patents protect the ornamental appearance of an article and are distinct from utility patents, which protect the way an article is used and functions.

As a design patent examiner, you will:


- Search prior art to ensure that a design is new and unique
- Review the application for conformity with formal requirements
- Write office actions communicating your findings on patentability to the applicants
